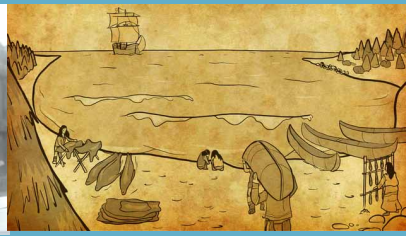


VISIT!
